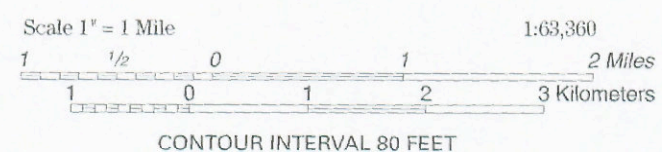

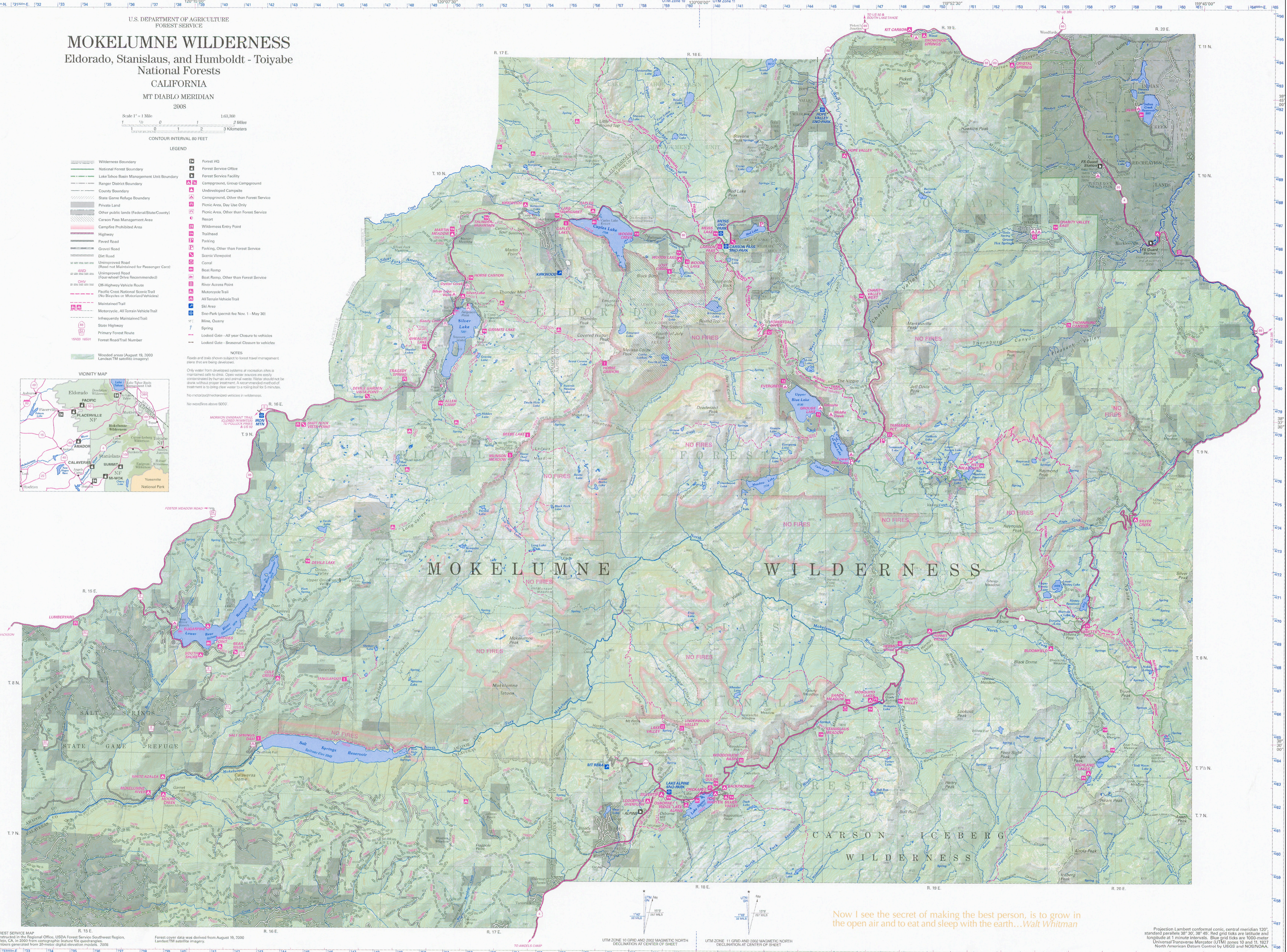
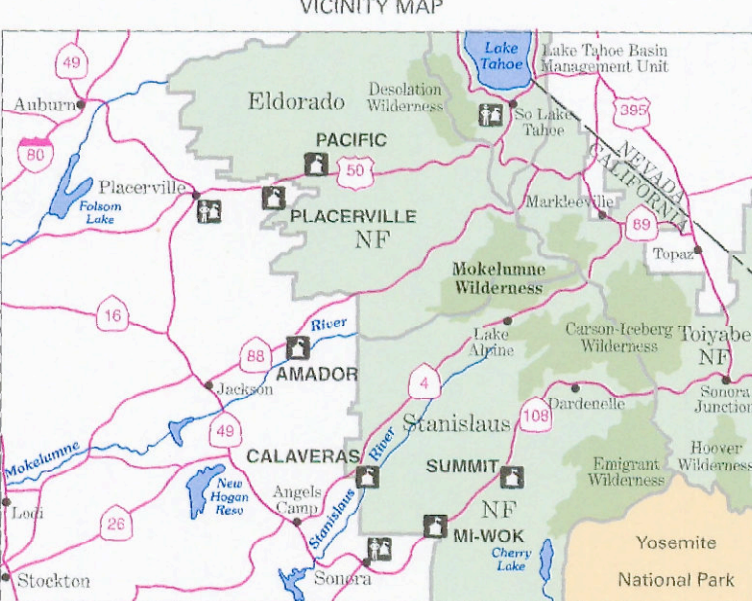


CONTOUR INTERVAL 80 FEET

**NOTES**  
Roads and trails shown subject to forest management plans that are being developed.  
Only water from developed systems at recreation sites is maintained safe to drink. Open water sources are easily contaminated by human and animal waste. Water should not be drunk without proper treatment. A recommended method of treatment is to bring clear water to a rolling boil for 3 minutes.  
No motorized vehicles in wilderness.  
No woodstoves above 8000'.
